	The ultimate goal of 1890 programs for small and limited resource farmers is to improve their income and quality of life
	while assuring environmental sustainability. The presenters will give examples of several focus areas including: helping
	with local economic output through training in computer technology, cooperative organization, marketing, biosecurity
	and emergency preparedness; livestock production program focusing on pasture pork production and small ruminant
	parasite control; grower schools in conjunction with research trials and demonstration farms; community gardens, youth
	and families; the Hmong project with a Vietnamese refugee community using high tunnels and exotic vegetable
	marketing; and a focus on diversification of forest land for annual income through growth of high value crops or livestoo
	among trees.
