

Leveraging Funds: Small investments, big returns

Northeast

Partnership grants leveraged funding data for 2007-2015 = \$18,089,812:\$6,709,371; so almost 3:1 in leveraged funds

Southern

21 IPM enhancement grants for 2015-2016=\$558,000. Funds leveraged by 9 out of 21 projects reporting in 2017: \$11,133,000 (20:1 leverage)

North Central

26:1 dollar return on investmentfrom working groups between2014-2015

Western

25:1 dollars leveraged from all grants* from 2014 to 2016, on average. (*28% of projects reporting)

National IPM Priority: Improve national capacity to support Extension IPM programs in all states and territories to deliver the technologies of the "New IPM" to users and practitioners

- Provide assistance with publication development including pest alerts

National IPM Priority: Improve funding for IPM research to develop the technologies of the "New IPM"

- IPM Data: Crop Elements, Pest Management Strategic Plans, Crop Profiles
- Letters of support and collaboration for grant proposals
- Support IPM Voice and other groups by providing documentation of the value of IPM and its impacts
- Foster collaboration among states resulting in grant proposals and awards
