Will know new location around January/February, announcements in the spring, and relocation completed by December 2019</li> <li>Duplicate Capacity payment: Don't try to return the money, NIFA will take care of it</li> <li>NIFA listens sessions: Please attend and submit written comments by 11/30 deadline. All are welcome to give feedback/comments. Be mindful of registration deadlines for in-person sessions.</li> <li>Strategic Plan: Working on a new plan as current plan expires soon. Will be aligned with USDA goals. Two goal areas, science and customer service. Will solicit input late fall/winter</li> <li>Many positions are currently staffed at interim capacity, due to retirements over the past year. The hiring focus at this time is for OGFM (grants and financial management).</li> <li>Ag Outlook Forum: The three topics proposed were Urban Ag, Science Solutions to Labor Challenges, and Ag Security. Sessions are under review now and information will be released soon on which topic will move forward.</li> <li>RFAs: McIntire-Stennis, 1890s Extension, and Evans-Allen are going forward as normal, but</li> </ul>
		EFNEP is being held back for now.

Gary indicated that it's very helpful and informative.</li> </ul>
