Directors:

- Considerable interest in helping with the infrastructure effort, however, some skepticism about where to get the money.
- Concern with China is spending twice the amount on research as US (good talking point)
- Not surprised by the ask: Democrats willing to submit programmatic requests Republicans want to better understand the need.

- Important to show ag staffers the full range of facilities when in the district, building on initial hill conversations.
- Talking points provided during visits (hill or district) sometimes show up in hearings and onepagers were well received.
- 1862 and 1890 coalition hill visits are powerful.
- Representative Tracey Mann (Kansas) wants to push the RFA forward.

#### Caron and Elizabeth:

- Farm bill and appropriations processes are heating up with a lot of hearings in which research infrastructure is part of the conversation.
- Undersecretary Jacobs-Young's testimony last week reinforced that infrastructure is a critical issue and she provided ARS examples (strategies to engage the Undersecretary with our talking points should be considered).
- CARET meeting this year focused on the research facilities request and next year's CARET meeting to focus on capacity programs.
- Dear colleague letter got 50 signatures. Numerous republicans on that letter.
- Sign on letter (Farm Bill letter) has ~300 signatures and closing on April 5<sup>th</sup>.
- Farm Bill conversations: working with several senators to see what coalitions they can build in both chambers.

## 6. BAC FY25 Priorities

- Looking for an earlier more proactive approach to developing appropriations priorities and sharing justifications.
  - Joint COPs (July 18-20) want initial set of parameters and priorities.
  - BLC can work with other ESS committees in developing plans (topic for next meeting?)
  - BLC can develop coalitions with other BAC members and better coordinate activities.
- BLC possible approaches
  - Members can solicit the regional perspective to bring to the committee.
  - BLC will put together our recommendation and our justification (story behind it).
  - 14% increases is our current long-term strategy but how do we develop the story about our priorities (thematic approach)
  - BAC has different groups and a coalition to develop a complementary approach for telling our stories will lead to a stronger effort.

#### 7. Infrastructure – RFA Implementation

 Assuming it gets funded, the BLC will need to work closely with the infrastructure working group to consider elements of an equitable implementation plan.
