Meeting Administration

Finish What We Started: Launching items on the DCC's Plan of Work

- DCC should begin planning DEI professional development presentations to be offered to agInnovation.
- Rick suggested Jennifer Ballinger, a Tribal Relations Specialist, U.S. Forest Service, who –
 recently presented to the Northeast Climate Hub on climate equity and research collaborations
 with sovereign tribal nations.
- There is interest in engaging tribal nations in collaborative ag research:
 - o Indigenous Traditional Ecological Knowledge (ITEK) is a hot topic at NIFA, in an effort to elevate Native voices across the federal government.
 - o 1994 institutions are developing new IRB processes.
- The committee is supportive of pursuing Jennifer Ballinger as the first quarterly DCC seminar/presentation, to be held in September.
- Tracy suggested the book *Incorporating Cultures' Role in the Food and Agricultural Sciences* by
 Florence Dunkel, who recently spoke at Montana State University. The group discussed the idea
 of setting up a webinar with Dunkel and purchasing copies of the book for each Experiment
 Station Director. There might be a post-meeting Q+A component to drive engagement at the
 session.

Other Business

- The DCC will re-issue its call to action as a "check in" with Experiment Station Directors.
 - Rick will draft language for consideration by the DCC to promote the CTA to agInnovation.
- Tracy suggests the DCC might draft a white paper as a follow-up to the first few webinars to capture lessons learned from presentations and DCC activities.
- Alton mentioned that Florida A+M University and University of Florida at Gainesville are
 concerned about policies being implemented by the state of Florida dictating what can or
 cannot be taught, what programming can be offered, and what is allowed to be discussed on
 campus. aglnnovation may have resources to provide programming to support colleagues at
 Florida 1890 and 1862 institutions.
