Meeting Agenda (Call Notes in Italics for clarity):

- 1. Welcome and introductions, as needed Steve Lommel, BLC Chair
 - One of our NIFA reps, Paula Geiger, former NIFA Budget Officer, has retired. Gary Mayo, NIFA Legislative Affairs Officer, will continue to serve as our NIFA rep to BLC.
 - Thank you to Gary Pierzynski for agreeing to represent BLC on the Committee on Legislation and Policy (CLP). CLP meets this Wednesday.
- 2. Washington, DC Update Elizabeth Stulberg, LBA (15 min)

- Continuing Resolution (CR): Elizabeth Stulberg discussed the recent passing of the CR through September 30 and some of the reasons behind it passing, along with the Democrats' concerns.
 No earmarks included, so technically, a budget cut, although the 1% across the board cuts were avoided. No NIFA or ARS programs cut, but also no facilities funding.
- Debt ceiling is likely to be increased as neither party wants default and potentially paired with spending cuts. Elizabeth also explained the relationship of the debt ceiling to the deficit to the group.
- Reconciliation aims for \$1.7T in spending cuts to reduce deficit but also with \$4.5T in tax cuts over 10 years.
- Ag Committee tasked with finding \$230B in cuts, likely impacting mandatory programs like SNAP. Reconciliation is a republican priority and will be tackled prior to addressing the FY26 budget.
- Overall, there seems to be good support for LGUs and Capacity funds, but there's still no Farm
 Bill and it appears it will be difficult to pass one at this time without funding for new admin's
 initiatives. NIFA lines are difficult to touch/target for cuts—there are many lines and are in
 statute. This is unlike NSF, where the new administration may decide to focus their funding on
 specific programs without Congressional approval.
- For those projects under review or terminated, RFPs during the Biden admin requested priorities including Climate and DEI, so researchers were responding to these priorities in their proposals.
 This administration will release new RFPs in alignment with this admin's priorities, but it will take some time to transition, causing grant delays.
- Further group discussion ensued on the federal budget, new admin's activities, and
 personnel/leadership changes. FYI: All federal agency employees, including NIFA, ARS and NSF,
 probationary staff that were fired have been re-instated.
 - Jun Park appointed as acting ARS administrator
 - o Dionne Toombs moved from NIFA to head ARS Nutrition section
 - Kevin Kephart now Associate Director for Programs at NIFA
 - New NIFA Director, Jaye Hamby, announced late last week. Doug Steele and LBA have plans on meeting with him soon.
- 3. Group Sharing/Discussion/Brainstorming (35 min, may not address all discussion topics during this meeting)
 - February DC CARET/AHS Meetings and Hill Visits:
 - What was heard regarding our primary funding lines, other funding agencies,
 reconciliation, appropriations, and the farm bill? See Elizabeth's advocacy report above.
 - Are there any questions that aglnnovation and BLC can answer for staff and members (communicate through LBA)?
 - Lisa Townson: Staffers seeking info on local impacts of federal pauses/changes
 - Derek McLean
 - 1. NE congressional member:
 - 1. Questions on high-path avian influenza, supply chains, researcher morale
 - 2. Interest in listening sessions with faculty on grant delays, project cancellations, and overall morale of faculty. These discussions were held with the member/staff.

- 3. Suggested a need for clear explanations on LGU structure, ARS vs university roles
- 4. Discussed ARS versus university, how training and facilities are used, other impacts to ag research.
- 5. Plan to follow up in June with the same group.
