VIEW RECORDING - 50 mins (No highlights)

1. Chair Updates – Steve Lommel

- agInnovation requesting \$300M for Hatch capacity funding (same as FY24 request)
- Requesting \$700M for AFRI competitive grants (up from \$500M in FY24)
- Concerns about \$700M AFRI ask being out of step with other increases

BAA will consider request; final amount may revert to \$500M

2. NAREE Advisory Board Overview - Deirdra Chester, Sreekala Bajwa

- Established 1977 to advise Secretary of Agriculture and REE mission area
- 15 members representing agricultural stakeholders
- 4 working groups: Specialty Crops, Citrus Disease, Genetic Resources, Pollinators
- Provides recommendations to the USDA on research priorities and program effectiveness
- The board serves as a conduit between the agricultural community and USDA science agencies.
- <u>Currently it lacks executive director/assistant due to retirements</u>, so Deirdra has been managing it on her own.

3. USDA Reorganization Letter from agInnovation - All

- Multiple letters already submitted (BAA, NC, and NE)
- agInnovation letter to focus on USDA partnerships and national-scope issues
- Aiming for constructive tone while highlighting concerns
- Key points:
 - Potential disruption and financial burden on universities from ARS and NIFA employee relocations and consolidated operations
 - Institutional knowledge preservation through proposed mentorship programs pairing departing and incoming staff during transition periods (mentorship might not be the best term here, though)
 - "Farmers first" messaging incorporates current administration language to demonstrate policy synchronization
 - o Reinvesting potential savings into U.S. agriculture
- Letter approved for finalization and submission to agInnovation Chair, Dr. Chandra Reddy

4. LBA and CGA Updates - Elizabeth Stulberg, Matt Peterson

- Government shutdown more likely now due to canceled Democratic leadership/President Trump meeting.
- Whichever party is in control of both houses and presidency is historically blamed for the shutdown, but it's uncertain if that will be the case this time.
- Duration of a potential shutdown can only be speculated at this time. Long-term would likely affect agricultural research funding.
- H-1B Visa Recently Proposed Changes by President Trump:
 - o Impose \$100,000 fees and 4-year duration limits on new visas.
 - Now (as of 9/23) proposing to prioritize higher-paid and higher-skilled foreign employees if the applications exceed the 85,000 limit.
- Healthcare sector would be greatly affected since 40% of internal medicine residents are currently here on H-1B visa status
- University hiring implications for non-citizens
- Possible alternative to use <u>O-1A outstanding individual visas</u> that are not capped, but do require somewhat burdensome paperwork.

• Right now, the recommendation is to do nothing, as lawsuits are likely and the new proposals might turn out to be illegal.
